Matthew 22:39

Matthew 20:28

Parable of the Unmerciful Servant

The wicked servant was so unloving, unkind and unmerciful was because there was no genuine gratitude in his heart.



With true gratitude in our heart, three powerful things will happen that will enable us to serve:



- It leaves no room for complaining.
- It reminds us that God is in control.



All of us can grow in gratitude and grow in service of our King.

Discouragement is a dangerous pitfall because the servant may be tempted to give up if it is not dealt with over time.



Elijah was a mighty servant of God and even a man like him can get discouraged.

After he had won a great victory on Mount Carmel, he was tired and discouraged.

1 Kings 19:4
He (Elijah) came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die . "I have had enough, Lord," he said. "Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors."

1 Kings 19:10
He replied (to God), "I have been very zealous for the Lord God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, torn down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. I am the only one left, and now they are trying to kill me too."

Elijah was saying to God "I have tried my best and have given my all but the people are unappreciative.

They have rejected your ways and they have rejected me. Enough is enough. It is not worth it."

Did Elijah have valid reasons to be discouraged?

People who are discouraged are usually facing very real issues and the negative feelings can be so overwhelming.

Like Elijah, some of you may be feeling rejected, disappointed, not needed and all alone.

And when a servant feels like that, you may feel that it is time to give up.

We need to receive renewal from the Lord and help from God to refocus.

When a person is exhausted, he is prone to be discouraged.

He needs proper rest and physical care.

When exhausted, seek proper rest.

Do not seek entertainment or recreation.

Just like Elijah, people too find a cave they can hide in the cave of Netflix, You-tube, TV or on-line gaming.

Physical renewal is not enough, Elijah received spiritual renewal as well.

1 Kings 19:8

So he got up and ate and drank.

Strengthened by that food, he travelled forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God.

Elijah travelled 40 days and nights to the mountain of God and we must do likewise to encounter God and receive a spiritual renewal.

God is not found in dramatic manifestations most of the time.

Some of the most meaningful spiritual encounters are found through the Lord's gentle whisper.



In hearing God's gentle whisper, perspective can change and you can then refocus.

"Be still and know that He is God."
