

- What is a banner?
- A flag that bore the name or the symbol of a tribe.
- Used by the units in the army to rally its troops.

Exodus 17: 8-16 (NKJV) 8 Now Amalek came and fought with Israel in Rephidim. 9 And Moses said to Joshua, "Choose us some men and go out, fight with Amalek. Tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the rod of God in my hand." 10 So Joshua did as Moses said to him, and fought with Amalek. And Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill.

¹¹ And so it was, when Moses held up his hand, that Israel prevailed; and when he let down his hand, Amalek prevailed. 12 But Moses' hands became heavy; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. 13 So Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword. 14 Then the LORD said to Moses, "Write this for a memorial in the book and recount it in the hearing of Joshua, that I will utterly blot out the remembrance of Amalek from under heaven." 15 And Moses built an altar and called its name, The-LORD -Is-My-Banner;

16 for he said,
"Because the LORD has sworn:
the LORD will have war with Amalek
from generation to generation."

- The fight was significant because the Lord was leading the Israelites, who were slaves, in their first fight.
- The Israelites were transiting from a way of life in Egypt towards the promises of God.

- There will always be opposition when people try to follow God's leading.
- The enemy will attack during transitions because the people are least prepared.
- We must learn to be vigilant in order to see the promises of God

- Individually, our destiny is tied up with the church and many of us will be in transition personally as well.
- Is the Lord trying to capture your attention and directing you to go another way?
- It is time to be awaken to know what God is saying.

- 1. Understanding Our Enemy
- Who was Amalek?
 - Grandson of Esau, who was the brother of Jacob.
 - When Esau was hungry, he carelessly traded his birth-right for just a bowl of soup.

- 1. Understanding Our Enemy
- ➤ He just yielded to his flesh and lost his inheritance to Jacob.
- Esau hated Jacob and sought to kill him.

1. Understanding Our

- Inemy
 Jacob became the founder of the Israelites; the people of the promise.
- For Esau, his grandson Amalek became the founder of the Amalekites.
- They represent the people of the flesh and had sought to destroy

- 1. Understanding Our Enemy
- The Lord was against the Amalekites because they knew God or at least, they knew about God but yet they would deliberately oppose God and His people.

17 Remember what the Amalekites did to you along the way when you came out of Egypt. 18 When you were weary and worn out, they met you on your journey and attacked all who were lagging behind; they had no fear of God. Deuteronomy

Romans 8:5-7
Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires.

1. Understanding Our Enemy Who is our Enemy?



- If we are not aware or vigilant, the flesh will win.

It is not just a matter of eating.

"The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; 20 idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions ²¹ and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like." Galatians 5-19-21

1. Understanding Our Enemy

- To ensure that God's purposes can be accomplished as we journey towards our promised land.

- To advance the Kingdom of God, we need soldiers who would be willing to lift up holy hands in prayer to God.
- To change our posture to say "Before we can do anything, we must make sure it is covered by prayer!"

- To advance the Kingdom of God, we need soldiers who would be willing to support those in need.
- There is strength and protection when Christians journey together.
- Rambo does not exist in God's kingdom and solo soldiers often die young.

- Have you decided to be in battle?
- You can choose to conform to the pattern of the world and try to make peace with the devil.
- Or you can choose to live your life as a Christian soldier.

- When you are fulfilling your roles as a soldier, there is a higher chance that you will fulfil the plans of God in 2020.
- And you will have the pleasure of helping someone fulfil their call in God as well.

What was Israel's secret weapon?



- When Moses named the altar Jehovah Nissi, he was declaring that:
 - the Israelites belonged to God
 - they were under God's protection

It was God who led the Israelites and fought for them in battle.

- The Lord who granted them victory as Moses lifted the rod high.
- As Moses lifted his hands high to the Lord, he was calling out to God for help; for his mercy and for his power.
- That was a picture of intercession.

- Is the banner applicable for us today?
- We are Christians carrying His name and carrying that banner.
- Jesus said in John 12:32
 "And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to Myself."

- As we lift Jesus up as the banner over our lives that He will draw all men to himself.
- When you draw people to God, you will draw the enemy's attention as well. It comes as a package.
- Are you willing to lift the banner high?

- When you have the enemy's attention, you will have God's attention as well.
- When Jesus is lifted up as your banner, you belong to God and you are under His protection.
